Field trips

We will be snorkeling the Roanoke River in hopes of seeing *Percina Rex*, Roanoke logperch, among Virginia's other native species. This will be a snorkel-only trip and no collecting will be permitted.

There will be another trip to the New River drainage to see more of Virginia's rare species. Again this trip will be a snorkel-only trip and no collecting will be permitted.

There are multiple trips setup to the New River, James River, Roanoke River, and the upper Tennessee drainage. This will present attendees with the opportunity to see a variety of species and a chance to collect some for personal use. Some species of interest will be Mountain redbelly dace, Crescent shiner, Redlip shiner, Kanawha darter, Roanoke darter, Saffron shiner and many, many others.
