Field trips:

Trip 1: **Buttahatchie River**- Saturday and Sunday, no RSVP necessary, no guide. Clear gravel rivers with high diversity in the Mobile drainage. Site 1 at Highway 45 (<u>33.704, -88.346</u>) and Site 2 Caledonia Bridge (<u>33.673, -90.763</u>).

Trip 2: **Homochitto River and Bogue Chitto:** Saturday and Sunday, no RSVP necessary, guided by Matt Roberts only on Sunday. Clear gravel rivers with high diversity in the Mississippi River and Gulf drainages, respectively . Site 1 at Homochitto River/McGehee Creek at Scott-Murray Road (<u>31.4705, -90.763</u>) and Site 2 at Stallings Bridge Road (<u>31.057, -90.225</u>). When parking do not block the turnaround for the outfitters.

Trip 3: **Bouie River, Black Creek, Big Creek:** Saturday and Sunday, no RSVP necessary, no guide. Blackwater Creeks in the Gulf drainages. Black Creek at Old Highway 49 (<u>31.053, -89.192</u>) and Ashe Nursey Road (<u>31.0515, -89.178</u>), Big Creek at Rockhill Brooklyn Road (<u>31.066, -89.269</u>), and Bouie River at Highway 49 (<u>31.425, -89.415</u>).

Trip 4: **Strong River, Pearl River, and tributaries:** Saturday and Sunday guided by Matt Wagner with lunch included. High diversity sites medium hardpan/gravel river, large gravel/sand river, and small sand/gravel tributary in the Pearl/Gulf drainage. Strong River (<u>31.885, -89.997</u>), is private property and we only have permission in the mornings. **Do not go without the group**. Afternoon visit to mainstem Pearl River Gravel/sandbar via boat (<u>31.239, -89.848</u>). Time permitting we will visit a headwater tributary to the Pearl River (<u>31.158, -89.846</u>). **Must RSVP by April 30th** to: matthew.wagner@mmns.ms.gov

Trip 5 – **Mississippi River:** Mainstem Mississippi River guided by Jan Hoover. This trip will only occur on Saturday and can safely accommodate 12 guests in boats. Boats are open, although the largest has a canopy for shade. This trip will depart from the Vicksburg City Front Boat Ramp (<u>32.351, -90.884</u>) at 8:30am. **Must RSVP by April 15** to: Jan.J.Hoover@usace.army.mil
